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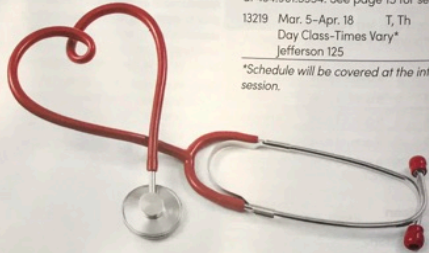
 

NEW EKG Technician

\$1,599

This comprehensive 60-hour EKG Technician Certification Program prepares students to function as EKG Technicians and to take the NHA – Electrocardiograph (ECT) Technician exam. This course will include important practice and background information on anatomy and physiology of the heart, medical disease processes, medical terminology, medical ethics, legal aspects of patient contact, electrocardiography and stress testing. Additionally, students will practice with EKG equipment and perform hands on labs including introduction to the function and proper use of the EKG machine, the normal anatomy of the chest wall for proper lead placement, 12-lead placement and other clinical practices.

Prerequisites: Must be 18 years of age with High School Diploma or GED®.

Registered Medication Aide

Full Tuition: \$1,101/FastForward Tuition: \$362

Upon successful completion of PVCC's Medication Aide Training program, you will meet the requirements of the Virginia Board of Nursing to be eligible to sit for the state exam to become a Registered Medication Aide (RMA). This program will cover topics such as: legal and ethical issues, preparing for safe administration of medication, introduction to pharmacology, administration of prepared instillations and treatments (oral medications, eye, ear, nose, etc.), documentation, storage and disposal of medications, special issues in medication administration and insulin administration. Students are required to have 100% attendance in both class and clinical.

Prerequisites: A copy of your active, unrestricted Virginia CNA certificate; background check, drug screen and PPD (negative TB testing) are required prior to the start of class. TB test and background check are not included in price. Attendance at an information session is required prior to registering for class. Pharmacy Technician

Full Tuition: \$1,599/FastForward Tuition: \$533

This comprehensive 50-hour program will prepare you to work as a pharmacy technician in a retail or other pharmacy setting and to take the Pharmacy Technician Certification Board's PTCB exam. Course content includes: pharmacy medical terminology, the history of pharmacy, the pharmacy practice in multiple environments, pharmacy calculations and measurements, reading and interpreting prescriptions and defining drugs by generic and brand names. Through classroom lecture and hands-on labs, you will review dosage calculations, drug classifications, the "top 200 drugs", I.V. flow rates, sterile compounding, dose conversions, aseptic technique, the handling of sterile products, total parenteral nutrition (TPN), dispensing of prescriptions, inventory control and billing and reimbursement. Note: In addition to classroom lecture and labs, this program includes a clinical externship through a local pharmacy. To be eligible for a clinical externship, students must successfully complete the 50-hour program, submit to a background check, drug screening and meet other requirements.

Prerequisites: Must be 18 years of age with high school diploma or GED®.

Phlebotomy Technician

Full Tuition: \$2,334/FastForward Tuition: \$778

Phlebotomy Technician Program with a Clinical Externship. The Phlebotomy Technician program prepares professionals to collect blood specimens from clients for the purpose of laboratory analysis. You will become familiar with all aspects related to blood collection and develop comprehensive skills to perform venipunctures completely and safely. Classroom and lab work includes terminology, anatomy and physiology; blood collection procedures; specimen hands-on practice; and training in skills and techniques to perform puncture methods.
